Cramblett Hall

The Cramblett Medical Clinic was built in 1974 and helped to provide outpatient services in more than 50 specialties including obstetrics, neurology, surgery and ophthalmology. The demolition made way for the new Phyllis Jones Legacy Park, that will be located in front of the new 27-story James Cancer Hospital and Solove Research Institute and Critical Care Center..

General Project Scope

Homrich was contracted to provide demolition services on Cramblett Hall which was located within 25 feet of the newly constructed Cancer Hospital and directly adjacent to an active emergency drive.

Due to the close proximity to the new building, extreme caution was taken in the demolition process as to not inflict damage on the newly constructed Cancer Hospital.

Located in the middle of an active major university campus, special safety, noise, and dust control measures were implemented. Other contractors were completing work in the immediate area and project coordination was an integral part of this demolition project to insure uninterrupted project execution. Homrich was given a rare accolade by The Ohio State Director of Environmental Services for outstanding dust and noise control throughout the project. This project was completed on time and without incidence.

In order for the General Contractor to meet LEED requirements, Homrich contract specified a 56% recycle rate of all materials removed from the demolition site. Of the 29,328 tons of material, Homrich was able to recycle 95% of the material from the project.
