

Former D&H Manufacturing Site – Springfield, OH

Demolition . Abatement . Remediation . Springfield, OH

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The D&H property was a 4.2 acre site and occupied approximately 200,000 sq. ft. of buildings. The site was home to a multitude of manufactures from 1880 until 2000, when the property was vacated. This project was part of the Clean Ohio Revitalization Fund (CORF).

General Project Scope

Homrich was contracted to perform demolition and remediation at the former D&H Manufacturing facility.

- Removal and disposal of all ACM pipe, tank, and duct insulation, transite panels and other ACM materials.
- Remove and dispose of all Universal Waste Materials, i.e. bulbs, PCB containing ballasts, residual waste, abandoned drums, tires, etc.
- Decommissioning of abandoned process equipment and residuals.
- UST removal and disposal.
- Clean and dispose of PCB containing transforms.
- Remediation of soils contaminated with PCB's hydrocarbons, metals, cyanide, arsenic and other VOCs.
- Backfill of all excavated areas where buildings/foundations and utilities were removed. Clean fill replaced contaminated soils where remediation took place.
- Removal of 100,000 gallon steel water tower standing approximately 180 ft. high.
