

University of Michigan Stadium – Press Box Demolition

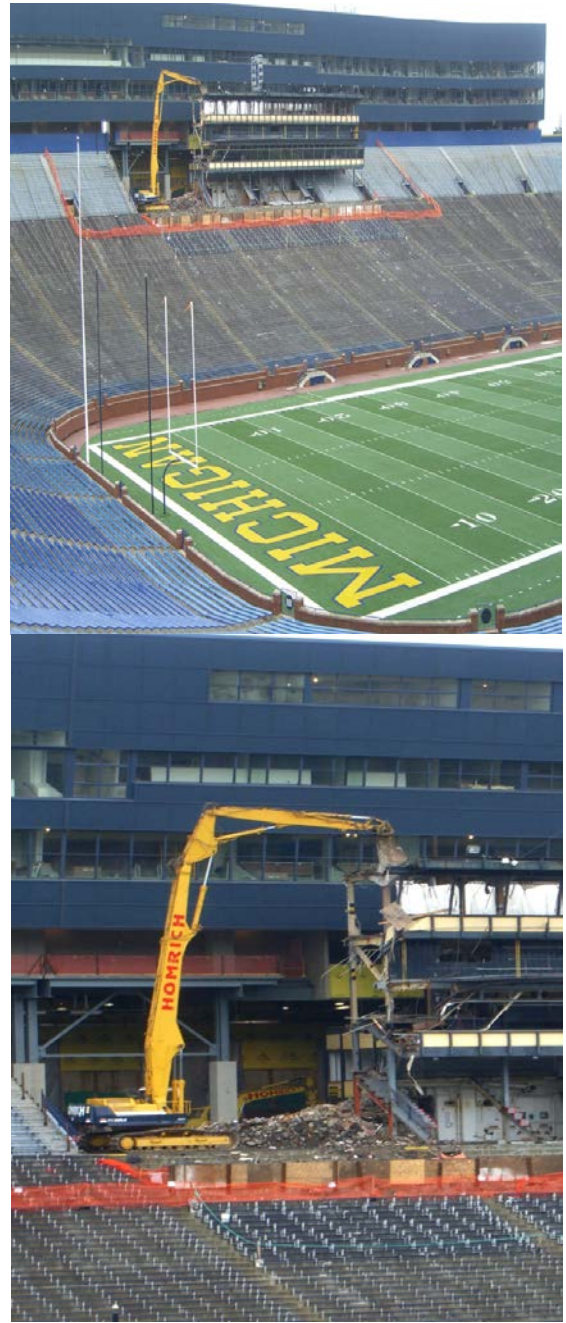

The first university of Michigan football game played on a home field occurred on May 12, 1883. The original wooden bleacher seating area seated 400 people. The Big House today has drawn in crowds of excess of 35 million fans and can pack the stadium full of 100,000 plus game after game.

General Project Scope

Homrich ended the 2009 year working at the Big House to strategically remove the former five story, 20,000 sq. ft. Press Box in just six weeks. The project consisted of abatement of regulated materials, manual demolition of the southern third of the building and removal of a portion of the roof in a proactive effort to prevent any damage to the new glass faced Press box, which was less than 3 feet away. The building was abated to remove asbestos, bulbs, ballasts, mercury switches, etc. Two Brokk 180s, two bobcat S70s and a PC220 were also used to aid in the removal of loose architectural debris, elevated concrete slabs, and debris handling. The project was completed safely, on time and on budget.
