## *U of M – Frieze Building & Carnegie Library – Ann Arbor, MI*

### *Historic Buildings*

The Frieze Building, formerly Ann Arbor High School, was purchased by the University of Michigan in 1956. It was demolished in early 2007 to make room for the North Quadrangle Residential and Academic Complex. The new building integrates the facade of the Frieze Building and uses various other pieces of architecture in the service of integrating old and new.

### *General Project Scope*

Homrich was contracted to perform the total demolition of a (5) story, 267,625 square foot wood & concrete buildings located on the University of Michigan Campus, in Ann Arbor, MI.

26,000 linear feet of piping insulation was abated prior to demolition.

Homrich was also charged with protecting the building's architecture. With precision and great care, several pieces of the outside façade were removed and placed on a new campus building downtown Ann Arbor. Homrich also demolished the main building to allow the façade to be incorporated into the new construction.
